## Cadence of a Deep Call: a Call to Remember the Love of God for us

Many people, young or old, male or female, educated or uneducated, rich or poor, do not live with the highest self-esteem or the greatest joy. Instead, they feel inadequate. They have self-doubt. Especially after they are retired, they don't think they are as effective, efficient or useful as they once were.

Sometimes, this low self-esteem leads to depression, despair, or even suicide.

It makes me sad to see people suffer from these thoughts of worthlessness. Sometimes, I see this even among the Christians.

Where does this come from? It could be a part of the natural rhythm in life; we can have high tides or low tides. We may have good days or bad days. We may have sunny days or rainy days. Sometimes we are up and sometimes we are down. But, when we have a chronic low self-esteem, this may come from the failures in the past: failures in relationships, failures in business and failures in our advancements.

No matter how many times we have failed, we are called to remember the love of God for us. I wish both of my children knew how precious and important they are to me and my wife, wherever they are, whatever they do. They are precious and important to me, regardless of their contribution or talents. The older I become, the more I value the time I have with my children, my friends and my church families. I don't need anything else but their presence with me. My wife and my children are the most beautiful and the most important treasure that God has given to me. I wouldn't trade them for anything else.

In the same way, God wants us to know how precious we are to him, regardless of our mistakes, failures and sins. The Psalmist said, "We are wonderfully and fearfully made." (Psalm 139) Again, he said that God has made us a little lower than God and has given us the dominion over every thing. He wonders at the depth of God's love, "Who are we that You are mindful of us and You take care of us? (Psalm 8) Jesus said to his disciples, "You are the light of the world and the salt of

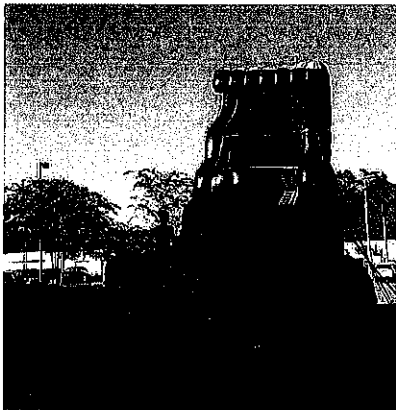
## CHILDREN & YOUTH MINISTRY

## Helping Children Look Like Themselves and Live Their Lives!



The various causes of hair loss in children don't result in just physical suffering. The change in their appearance can drastically undermine their self-image and sabotage their self-esteem. To help heal the pain of these struggles, Certified Cosmetic Therapist Jeffrey Paul founded Wigs for Kids, a non-profit hair donation organization that has been serving children suffering from hair loss since 1981. Wigs for Kids is a cooperative effort among Certified Cosmetic Therapists throughout North America who share a common goal. "Children shouldn't have to worry about how they look, especially when they're in the middle of a health crisis," says Jeffrey Paul. "We want to give these kids the opportunity to feel good about themselves again."

The value of the Hair Replacement Systems Wigs for Kids provides is approximately \$1,800. The wigs are custom-made. Jeffrey Paul says, "Each prosthesis is hand-tied and is made completely from human hair. We make sure they look just like a child's own hair." They won't come off on the baseball field or on the playground," Kids can count on them. And because kids look just the way they did before, they feel better about themselves. They look in the mirror and their eyes light up. To see that light in their eyes – that's priceless."

### Question: Where does Wigs for Kids get the hair?

### Answer: People like Margie Steve



Margie is the 14 year old daughter of John & Bobbie Steve. She is in the 8th grade at Shallotte Middle School. Margie is active in Camp's Youth Group. She is also generous with her time: volunteering in the food pantry, working wherever help is needed, including filling buckets for the flood victims on Friday, Sept. 21st. Blessed with a thick head of hair, Margie decided at age 11 that she wanted to donate hair for wigs. At that time, she donated her hair to Locks of Love. Two years ago she felt "called" to donate her hair again. However, she learned that Locks of Love charged people for their wigs. Searching the web, she found Wigs for Kids which doesn't charge for the wigs and decided that she would donate to them. After 2 years, her hair reached past her waist and it was time to get it cut for the wigs.

The donor's hair must be freshly washed and no products should be used on it. Securing her freshly washed, long locks with hair ties, Margie went to Wal-Mart for a haircut. Her hair was then put in plastic ziplock bags and mailed to Wigs for Kids.

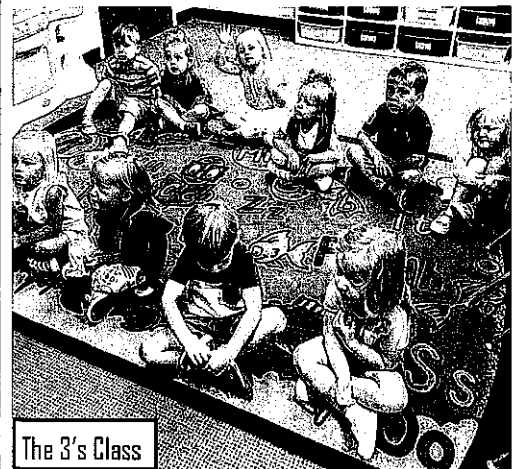
## MOTHER'S MORNING OUT MINISTRY

Camp Church MDM started our new school year with great excitement and the anticipation of many blessings. The teachers, Preacher Won and Pastor Sheena met with parents and children during Open House on August 30th. Mrs. Kim loved seeing the sweet children waiting patiently outside the doors at 9AM on September 4th for our first day of class. Fifty-five children are enrolled in the program this year, but not all come on the same day. The regular "Mother's Morning Out" program is still Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday mornings and has an enrollment of around fifty children. Children are also invited to attend Marvelous Monday or Fun Friday on a month to month basis. Parents can take advantage of this program if their schedule changes, they need an additional day for appointments or sometimes children just really love our program and want to attend more than just the three days. Some of our Marvelous Monday/Fun Friday children do not attend the regular program as those days do not meet the needs of their family or our classes are full.

Our amazing staff this year is so talented and on fire for Jesus. Kristy Gunther and Ava Harris are once again teaching in the infant class. Jennifer Childers and Mandy Pope are our Tot teachers which is a new class designation this year. A tot is basically a younger toddler, usually around 10 months to 15 months when school begins. Holly Cross and Christine Spina are teaching the traditional Toddler class. Lisa Ward and Claire Yoder are teaching the 2's class - Ms. Lisa has been with MDM for 19 years! Lisa Colby and Erin Martin-Holmes are teaching the 3's class again this year and we welcome Natalia Dillahay and Emily Preuter as our 4's class teachers. Mrs. Betsey Tusai is gracing us with her talents once again as our music teacher every Tuesday and Nancy Smith of Movement Works is teaching a movement or baby yoga class every other week to the entire school. Mrs. Kim Isenhour is serving in her twelfth year as Director and she is more excited than ever for the upcoming year.

Over the past few years, MDM children have participated in an Art Show fundraiser. You may have seen these shows displayed in the Fellowship Hall from year to year. After five years of shows, we finally raised enough money to build a very nice shelter on our playground. One of our parents, Mr. Adam Childers, is a builder and he has volunteered his design and building expertise to help get the job done. Trustees have approved the plan and we are working now to make sure the structure is placed correctly so it is in a harmonious spot with any future building the church may do. Once this planning phase is done, we hope to begin construction in January. The church will have access to this shelter as well, so all groups will have a covered, outdoor place to meet.

Camp Church MDM has several needs this year that church members may be able to provide! We are once again putting together an Art Show and will need help creating our works of art with the children. We could use volunteers to work with the children every other week. Donations of paint, canvas materials, or other art supplies would be appreciated. As a part of the Art Show we also have a silent auction with items that are donated. In the past these items have included a wide range of things like weekend getaways, sports memorabilia, artwork, clothing, jewelry, gift cards, etc. If you are interested in donating any item or your time, please let Kim Isenhour know! (910)269-3071. We can always use supplies like Clorox wipes, baby wipes, masking tape, gallon Ziplock bags, AA batteries, white cardstock paper and Lysol spray. Donations of children's' books or toys are also appreciated. We especially need sand toys at the moment! Toys should be in good working order, no broken pieces and should be able to be cleaned. We can't take toys that are soft in nature. Stuffed animals or toys that can't be regularly washed with a Clorox spray are not healthy for our children and can't be used. Thanks so much to all of you who have donated to us in the past! We certainly appreciate all the love!

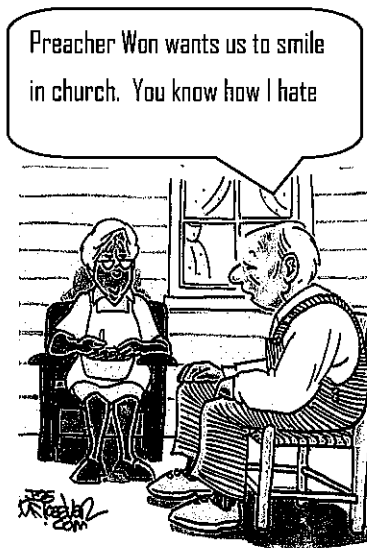
## REFLECTION

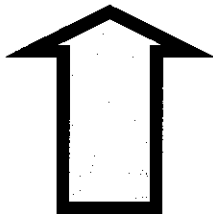

### Physical Characteristics of a United Methodist Woman

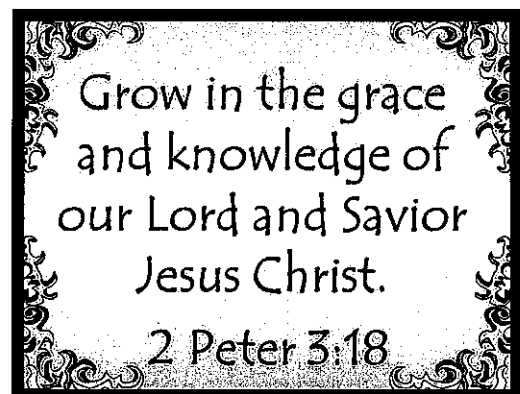
- Bloodshot eyes** from participating in the Reading Program.
