Sometimes we need some perspective. After reading an email about The Jesus Tree from Joyce, I decided to take a ride on my bike out toward the tree. The tree is huge! Some think it has been around for over 2000 years. How many hurricanes has it weathered in its lifetime? Long before there was Inlet View Bar and Grill, before a Shallotte, long before there was a road, before there was a United States that tree was there. Wars and so much more have come and gone over the years and the tree has lived through it all. Standing next to the tree, I found myself thinking about myself, the church and time. I thought about the photographs of the former pastors of Camp UMC on the wall at the church. Sometimes it is good to have a little perspective: to remember that we are not the first ones here and we won't be the last and to remember that God sees the long view of all things. The scriptures can help us have

I wonder if this is part of Jesus heading into the wilderness led by the Spirit. Was it an opportunity for him to get a little perspective before heading into a lifetime of life ministry? I wonder if the wilderness time for God's people in Exodus in part was an opportunity for God's people to get some perspective. To get some distance from the ways of the past and see the possibility of a new future with God. Sometimes I get excited and want to rush things before it is God's time, but I am thankful for The Jesus Tree being a witness to a larger perspective.

God's work of salvation continues to shape us as a beloved people here at Camp UMC to be a blessing to the world as we make disciples and join God in transforming the world. As we share this particular of time together, how is God nudging you to get a little perspective? After these

ABOUT OCTOBER

Anglo-Saxons called October "Wintirfyllith", meaning "fullness of winter" because it had the first full moon of the winter season.

According to folklore, if the deer have a **gray coat** in this month, you should expect a hard winter.

The **zodiac signs** for October are Libra (September 23 – October 22) and Scorpio (October 23 – November 21).

The **birthstones** for October are the tourmaline and the opal. Tourmalines display a wide spectrum of colors, such as yellow, pink, blue, red, green, black or brown, and they are believed to help you stay calm under pressure, bring peace and tranquility and defeat emotions like anger and jealousy. Opals exhibit different colors (green, white, yellow, blue, pink etc.) depending on the conditions under which they were created. Opal gemstones are believed to cure eye infections, strengthen memory, calm nerves and enhance creativity.

The **traditional flower** of the month of October is the calendula, symbolizing comfort, healing, protection and grace.

October 2020 Brings Two Full Moons

The first full Moon of fall, the **Harvest Moon**, will appear on Thursday, October 1st. Later in the month, on Saturday, October 31st (Halloween), the second full Moon appears. This is the **Hunter's Moon**, which will be special for two reasons: it's a rare **Halloween Full Moon** and a **Blue Moon** (Halloween night)! What exactly is a Blue Moon? ["It is a phenomenon whereby the moon appears bluish due to smoke or dust particles in the atmosphere. A second full moon in a calendar month. a blue moon" (Dictionary)]

There will be two meteor showers in October. The **Draconid meteor shower** will occur in the late evening of October 9th, and will be visible in the Northwest in the late evening. The **Orionid meteor shower** will occur in the predawn on October 21th–22nd. It will be visible in the South..

GREAT NEWS

Camp UMC is open for Sunday worship on a limited basis, 70 people are permitted at each service. There will be one service each Sunday. The services will alternate between an 8:30AM Praise and Worship service and an 11:00AM Traditional service. Check the calendar (*last page of newsletter*) to see schedule.

HOW IS THIS GOING TO WORK?

In order to attend a church service, you will need to make a reservation. (No walk-ins allowed.) Call Robin at the church office (910-754-4840) on the Monday before the Sunday of the service you want to attend. Remember only 70 people can attend each service.

WHAT WILL HAPPEN AT CHURCH ON SUNDAY?

- Attendees will be required to wear masks that cover their noses and mouths.
- Attendees must practice safe distancing of at least 6 feet (except within family units)
- Attendees must enter and exit the sanctuary **only** through the front doors.
- Ushers will seat attendees to a socially distanced pew and then help each family exit after the service.
- Families with children are welcome to worship. There will not be a children's time but a children's worship activities bag is provided.
- Offerings will be collected in baskets by the sanctuary.

NOTE: The staff has made a video about how you should come to church. Go to Camp's website, click on the Facebook icon and scroll **down** and **down** and **down** until you come to the Soft Reopening Video. Click on it and see how well the staff can act!

The Youth Group is Up and Running!




The GriefShare Ministry has started. Meetings are on Thursdays from 6:30PM-8:00PM and are



Recycle Materials Accepted by Brunswick County

We have contacted Waste Management and were advised as to what items are accepted for recycling.

GLASS:

Accepted: Glass food and beverage con-

tainers; clear, green & brown

Not Accepted: Plate glass, ceramics and

non-food containers

How to Recycle: Rinse out all containers. Lids need to be removed, but can be recycled. Labels may be left on.

ALUMINUM & STEEL

Accepted: All aluminum beverage cans, clean aluminum foil and trays of food containers and metal (steel) food cans.

Not Accepted: Any of the above that are

contaminated with food items.

How to Recycle: Rinse out all containers.

PAPER PRODUCTS:

Accepted: Newspapers, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, phone books, and paper board boxes such as cereal, shoe etc. And corrugated cardboard

Not Accepted: Styrofoam, food contaminated or wax coated type boxes.

PLASTICS:

Accepted: All plastics # 1 through #7 (check bottom of container for #)

Not Accepted: Any other plastic containers including plastic shopping bags or plastic wrap and **NO TOYS**

How to Recycle: Rinse out all containers
