John Wesley's Covenant Prayer



"I am no longer my own, but thine.
Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt.
Put me to doing, put me to suffering.
Let me be employed by thee or laid aside for thee,
exalted for thee or brought low for thee.
Let me be full, let me be empty.
Let me have all things, let me have nothing.
I freely and heartily yield all things
to thy pleasure and disposal.
And now, O glorious and blessed God,
Father, Son, and Holy Spirit,
thou art mine, and I am thine. So be it.
And the covenant which I have made on earth,
let it be ratified in heaven. Amen."

In 1775, John Wesley introduced a covenant service as an important part of spiritual life in the Methodist Societies. This renewal service was a time for the Methodists to gather annually in a time of self-examination, reflection and dedication, wholly giving up themselves and renewing covenant with God.

Repentance through confession and commitment was a key focus of the service, demanding humility from those willing to submit themselves to the dynamic words stated within the liturgy.

Wesley recognized that people needed not just to accept but also to grow in relationship with God, emphasizing the need of God's grace and love to constantly prompt and transform us. Therefore, we should continually seek and pray to grow in holiness and love of God and love for each other.

I felt it important that we begin a new year in the life of Camp UMC, by reflecting on the historic liturgy in the Wesleyan Covenant Service, reminding ourselves that we, as the Body of Christ, willingly adhere ourselves together, embracing the yoke of Christ upon us.

The Covenant Prayer and service calls us to a missional life, devoted to following Jesus and serving as Christ' representatives in the world he loves and is working to redeem.

2023 Budget

The 2023 budget was approved by the Church Council at its December 17, 2022 meeting. It is a balanced budget in the amount of \$500,000. The budget process began in September. Budget Draft One projected offerings of \$573,100. This was based upon the January through August 2022 offerings annualized. Requested expenses totaled \$684,500. As the budget process continued there was a noticeable drop in weekly offerings. It was so substantial that by Draft Five the 2023 offering estimate was lowered to \$500,000. This resulted in requested expenses being reduced by \$184,500. These reductions are shown in the following table.

This was a painful process. All ministries shared in the reduction.

We will carefully monitor the financial situation and pray for an increase in offerings.

Finally, it is believed that the issues facing the United Methodist Church are having a direct impact on this situation. In spite of the reason please know that the Lord's work continues — it does not take a time-out because of differences.


Thank you so very much for all of your prayers and support this year. We are so truly grateful and wish you all a Very Merry Christmas and Blessed New Year!
