JOHN 17:20-26

Bishop Shelton also served as the Executive Director of the United Methodist Radio Hour broadcast for seven years as the weekly preacher.



LENT STARTS ON FEBRUARY 22nd

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on **Ash Wednesday** and ends on **Holy Saturday**. The word "Lent" comes from the Anglo Saxon word *lencten*, meaning "lengthen" and refers to the lengthening days of spring. The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by new converts and then became a time of penance by all Christians. Today, Christians focus on relationship with God, growing as disciples and extending ourselves, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of ourselves for others.

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter." This is why you will see the designation "Sunday in Lent" rather than "Sunday of Lent" in the naming of these Sundays. On each Lord's Day in Lent, while Lenten fasts continue, the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.

We will host a **Parents Night Out** on February 4th from 4:00-7:00PM in the toddler/nursery room. Children ages birth-12 years old are invited to attend!



*What is PORCH?

Neighbors helping neighbors. As 25.6% of children in Brunswick County, NC, live in food insecure homes. A year-round problem of hunger affects our community. To help ensure our community, school and care resources can meet these needs PORCH – South Brunswick coordinates monthly neighborhood food drives in 25+ neighborhoods across southern Brunswick County. There is also a PORCH – North Brunswick, that coordinates a monthly food drive.

The Outreach committee provided breakfast for the staff of Union Elementary on January 23rd. The teachers were involved in training sessions on this day. We hope the biscuits provided started each day on a positive note for the staff!



Since 2008, with your help and generosity we have been serving the homeless and hurting in Brunswick County.

There are NO permanent shelters, NO community Kitchens and NO public transit system in Brunswick County. Streetreach advocates, mobilizes and provides temporary shelter, meals and linkage to other resources for those that are unsheltered.

We appreciate the support you have given us as we work to accomplish our goals.


