## "Mr. Gorbachev, tear down this wall!"

President Ronald Reagan's address at the Brandenburg Gate June 12, 1987

Those now-famous words of then President Ronald Reagan continue to reverberate in the minds of many of us that remember that famous speech delivered to the people of West Berlin.

I was reminded of this as my eyes became focused on the small piece of the Berlin Wall that sits on my desk. Given to me by a friend with government ties who was present when the wall collapsed, was given to me along with these words: "Terry, we should be better at building bridges than walls."

On November 9, 1989, the world watched the fall of the Berlin Wall. I remember watching the frenzy as people around the world were filled with jubilation. Families were reunited. West Berliners greeted East Berliners with glasses of champagne as they crossed the border, many for the first time. Strangers embraced in excitement as people were filled with joy, their emotions were overwhelmed by the delight of what they were experiencing.

As I slowly rolled this treasured piece of history in my hand, I squeezed it a bit tighter when I found the words of Jesus taking root in my mind: "Every kingdom divided against itself is headed for destruction, and no city or house divided against itself will stand."

Jesus was consistent when addressing his followers on the importance of bridging ways in which to tear down walls of division, yet so many, even Christians, continue to clutch and encourage divisive behavior. To flame the emotions of our friends and neighbors is one of the most unhealthy things we can be a part of. It's not who God created us to be.

As siblings in Christ, we are called to seek out ways to erase brokenness and embrace dialogue that brings all of God's children around tables of fellowship and in seeking to live out our mission of, "Making Disciples of Jesus Christ for the Transformation of the World."

To witness our world seeking ways in which to offer powerful displays of love for Christ and neighbor should give each of us an added prayer to offer around our Thanksgiving tables later this month.

The gift of peace and fellowship cannot be created in a Petri dish. It only comes to us through honesty, integrity and open conversations grounded in love.





### **The Ignite Church Conference**

Three representatives from Camp (Tom Evans, Hart Merriam and Allison Hunter) attended a three-day Methodist Church Conference in Overland Park, Kansas, from September 27<sup>th</sup> through the 29<sup>th</sup>. This event was hosted by the Church of the Resurrection, where Adam Hamilton, a well-known religious author, is the senior Pastor. Pastor Terry Williams and Tamy Munns also participated on-line.

The purpose of the conference was to learn about best practices from some acclaimed speakers about invigorating the ministries of our churches with renewed ideas, tools, and passion. There were also break-out sessions where both clergy and lay people provided advice and suggestions for effective ministry from their personal experiences. The conference was attended by over 1,800 people (about half being Pastors) from 46 States and six countries.

Together, Camp's participants are developing an Action Plan outlining initiatives they learned about at the conference and believe will be effective for our Church. This Action Plan was presented to the AdMinistry Team for their consideration at the October 26<sup>th</sup> meeting.

The Action Plan includes some ideas to:

- 1. Improve on-line access to our worship services
- 2. Improve our Web Site
- 3. Upgrade our 'Welcome Center' and follow-up process for new guests
- 4. Increase outreach to non-members
- 5. Invigorate our Mission Statement and add a Vision with a Plan for achieving that Mission
- 6. Initiate and enhance new member classes, and
- 7. Expand opportunities for children and youth participation in worship and giving

As decisions are made on these proposals they will be announced with appropriate detail, and teams will be created and tasked with implementation. We anticipate there will be both short-term and long-term initiatives as a part of this effort.

Getting to Know the New Life Praise Band Members

Dennis Hetzel is one of the guitarists with the New Life Praise Band. See below to learn a little more about him.

Where were you born and raised? I was born in Chicago and raised in the northwest suburbs. My journalism career took us to Kenosha, Wisconsin, Madison, Wisconsin; York, Pennsylvania; Hebron Kentucky (near Cincinnati) and Columbus, Ohio before we moved fulltime to Holden Beach in 2019. We have been coming to Brunswick County for about 30 years.

What are three things you would like the congregation to know about you? I probably became a journalist in part because I loved sports. I was a lousy athlete, but it turned out I could write. It started when I convinced the editor of our local weekly newspaper to pay me to cover high school sports when I was 16. I was a lobbyist for eight years before I retired as executive director of the Ohio News Media Association. It gave me an up-close appreciation for how hard it is for the good, caring politicians to get anything meaningful done and a deep fear for our country's future as zealots gain more power. They are the money changers in the temple. I've written three novels that were published by Headline Books, including the most recent one – a thriller called "Azalea Bluff" that is set in Brunswick County. (They're dirt cheap on Amazon if you have a Kindle reader.)

How long have you attended Camp UMC? We began attending earlier this year after, unfortunately, our former church voted to disaffiliate from the UMC. We're very glad to be here and appreciate how welcoming everyone has been.

What musical instruments do you play? I mainly play bass in several bands, so it's fun for me to be on the Praise Team where I get to play guitar.

What is your favorite genre of music? I listen to a lot of Americana rock (Tom Petty, Jason Isbell, etc.); the kind of music you hear on the Outlaw Country channel on Sirius XM. I try to stay fresh in different genres vs. being locked into classic rock, though I still love many, many of those great old songs.

What is your favorite musical group? Current favorites are Joe Bonamassa, Jason Isbell and the 400 Unit and a band I just discovered, Robert Jon & The Wreck, which is sort of Lynyrd Skynyrd meets Tom Petty meets the Allman Bros.

What is your favorite Praise music song? Almost anything by Lauren Daigle. She could sing the phone book and we'd all listen.

Anything else you would like the congregation to know about you? When you meet my wife, Cheryl, you will realize that there's no question I made at least one excellent choice in my life. We have three terrific, successful kids and two grandchildren but only wish we weren't so scattered. (Dallas, Orlando and Cincinnati areas.)



# CAMP UNITED METHODIST CHURCH MOTHER'S MORNING OUT MINISTRY

Happy Place. Happy Children. One of the greatest anxieties for parents is having the assurance their children are safe and well cared for when they are separated. When the car doors open and the precious cargo excitedly exit the Mom's Morning Out (MMO) parking lot, parents are put at ease by a welcoming staff and warm

greetings from other like-minded parents. They have become like family; not through a kinship, but through a genuine caring for one another and the program they have vested their children in this relationship was more than evident when over fifty people --staff, friends, children and parents, showed up to see MMO director, Kim Fluharty "ring the bell" as she completed her last cancer treatment. In all the weeks since Kim started her chemo and radiation treatments, she never missed a day of work. It was obvious that it was not just science that was responsible for her road to recovery, but God's grace and an MMO family who love her.

In 1993 Deanna Inions saw a need for a Christian based infant to pre-school program for the Shallotte area. With the cooperation of Camp United Methodist Church and the support of the community, Deanna's vision became a reality. A couple of years later, Kelly Barefoot took the helm and furthered the mission Deanna began. She arranged fundraisers to build a playground with safe equipment for the children. Kelly saw an opportunity to join the young with the old and started a grandparent program that would have the children adopt some of the older members of the church as surrogate grandparents. Blessings merged with both age groups and some of those relationships continue today. Kelly now serves on the advisory board of MMO.

Kim Fluharty retired in 2020 after teaching special education for many years in the public school system. Kim started working with the two-year olds at MMO soon after retirement. Her friend, Kim Isenhour had been the MMO director for ten years at that time; but, decided to retire, leaving the director position open. Kim Fluharty was not really seeking a second career as the director, but a God calling for sure when she talked to other staff and MMO parents. The program layout, curriculum and over-all environment enticed her to accept the position. Since then, Kim has taken MMO to a new level with the utmost security measures in place.

The MMO children are divided into separate classrooms, based on age. The curriculum includes age-appropriate educational components and Bible lessons. Once a week all children come together for Chapel. Moms Morning Out is more than a day care and pre-school located on the church property; it is an important commodity within Camp UMC. The children enjoy helping to prepare food for Camp's Wednesday Night Bible Study and putting packages together for the Friday night community meals. MMO is very much a part of the church's outreach.

Children are said to have five love languages —physical touch (affection), words of affirmation (praise and encouragement), acts of service (chores without complaint), gifts (special surprises) and quality time (distraction free time). These, along with the academic studies and Christian foundation that MMO invests in their children, gives each child the ability to succeed and exceed the qualifications of kindergarten. There are many success stories and student testimonies to prove this.

A vision that began thirty years ago has become an integral part in the lives of many children, as well as the life of Camp United Methodist Church. The enrollment has more than tripled since the beginning of the program and continues to grow with a waiting list of 75. Positive things are happening with the MMO children. Let's continue to provide them with our support, praise and prayers in the days ahead.
