The second opportunity is Camp's Christmas Offering which will be donated to our Friday Night Meals program.



## **Recent Decisions by the Church Council**

During its most recent meeting, the Church Council decided to implement a significant reform of the Church Budget process beginning in calendar year 2025. Following a recommendation from the recently completed Church Audit, and a proposal from the Finance Committee, the Council voted to reduce the number of Restricted Funds included in the Budget.

The purpose of Restricted Funds is to assure that when an offering is given for a specific purpose, such as for music or children's ministry, it is used as directed. The problem with restricted funds is that they add significant complexity to the accounting process and to budget execution. Camp currently has 25 restricted funds, and each one has a balance, income and spending that must be tracked. Dollars directed to those funds cannot be used for our most significant expenses, including for salaries, the electric bill, insurance, or repairs and maintenance of the buildings. All those expenses must be paid from unrestricted offerings and interest income. It is also difficult to always accurately debit the correct account as bills are paid, often by credit card. This is because, for several types of spending, There are both restricted funds and line-item funds in the general budget.

In addition, as our Accounting Firm tracks income and spending against our budget they cannot (at the price we pay them) include restricted fund income in our books. Every month they provide detailed income and spending data which understates the income received. They report on all spending, but only on unrestricted income. That leaves us with the misleading appearance of a substantial deficit in our balance sheet which is, in truth, substantially offset by income to restricted funds. For example, at the end of October they reported a \$65,000 deficit. That amount did not include about \$50,000 in income to restricted funds.

This decision does not eliminate all restricted funds. It takes 11 current restricted funds and combines those dollars with exiting line items in the Church Budget. People may still direct portions of their offerings to these 11 funds and those dollars will be added to the line item as directed. Every month our Accountant produces what is called the budget versus actual report. We provide them with a Summary of Offerings Report, and for 2025 we will create a new section in that report called Budget Line Offerings, where offerings directed to those 11 specific purposes will be reflected. Our accountant will use that report to provide a balance for each of those line items after netting the income and spending for that category.

The 11 Restricted Funds being moved into budget line items are: The Alter Guild, Bereavement, Children's Ministry, Ladies on the Bus, Missions, Music, Methodist Men, Small Group Studies, UMCOR, Wonderful Wednesdays and Youth Ministries. This change will not eliminate the complexity of dealing with restricted funds but is a significant simplification.

## Summary of Financial Results YTD through October 2024. Revenue & Expenses (10 months)

Offerings = \$ 430,246,96 +Other Revenue 19,171.04 -Expenses \$ (514,865.34)

I am pleased to report that our YTD budget deficit through Oct has decreased by \$12,737.34 since the end of Sept. Our YTD giving to church Restricted Funds such as Friday Night Meals, Food Pantry, etc. is \$63,318.52 through Oct. This amount is not reflected in #'s above, since it is "outside" of the church budget. We continue to have Reserves in the bank to cover our deficit. We are in solid financial shape.
