Recent Decisions by the Church Council

During the last Church Council meeting, which was held on November 14th, it was decided that a love offering would be taken at the Caroling at Camp Concert with Phil Giallombardo, and that the offering from that evening would be split between the Lord's Food Pantry and Streetreach (an organization that ministers to the homeless).

The Lord's Food Pantry serves those in need every Saturday. This year they are on track to serve over 20,000 individuals. The food provided is given based on the size of the family in need and is enough for 2- or 3-days worth of meals. Camp is, of course, one of the 13 area churches that volunteer at the pantry monthly.

Streetreach is a faith based ministry and, on the frontline serving the homeless, prisoners and victims of human trafficking. They recently added a mobile shower to their services which include food, clothing, and emergency shelter in local motels. They also provide case management services hoping to break the cycle of homelessness.


SCUBA CHRISTMAS PLAY


